- Full-stack development on Shapper: independently implemented features, integrated libraries (Leaflet, DataTables), developed web services, consumed external APIs, wrote SQL queries, and optimized code
- Designed conceptual data models (CDM) and built databases from technical and functional specifications; developed Back Office interfaces using an internal framework
- Designed and implemented custom web services and REST APIs using an entity-based architecture (CodeIgniter)
- Integrated the trusted third-party service Yousign into a business application (REST API, webhooks, document generation and tracking, idempotent event handling)

- Modernized the UI of a business application: migrated from Bootstrap 3 to 4, fixed display regressions, and updated/replaced front-end libraries

- Set up three isolated development environments using Docker
- Improved code maintainability by refactoring and centralizing form field logic into reusable functions
